

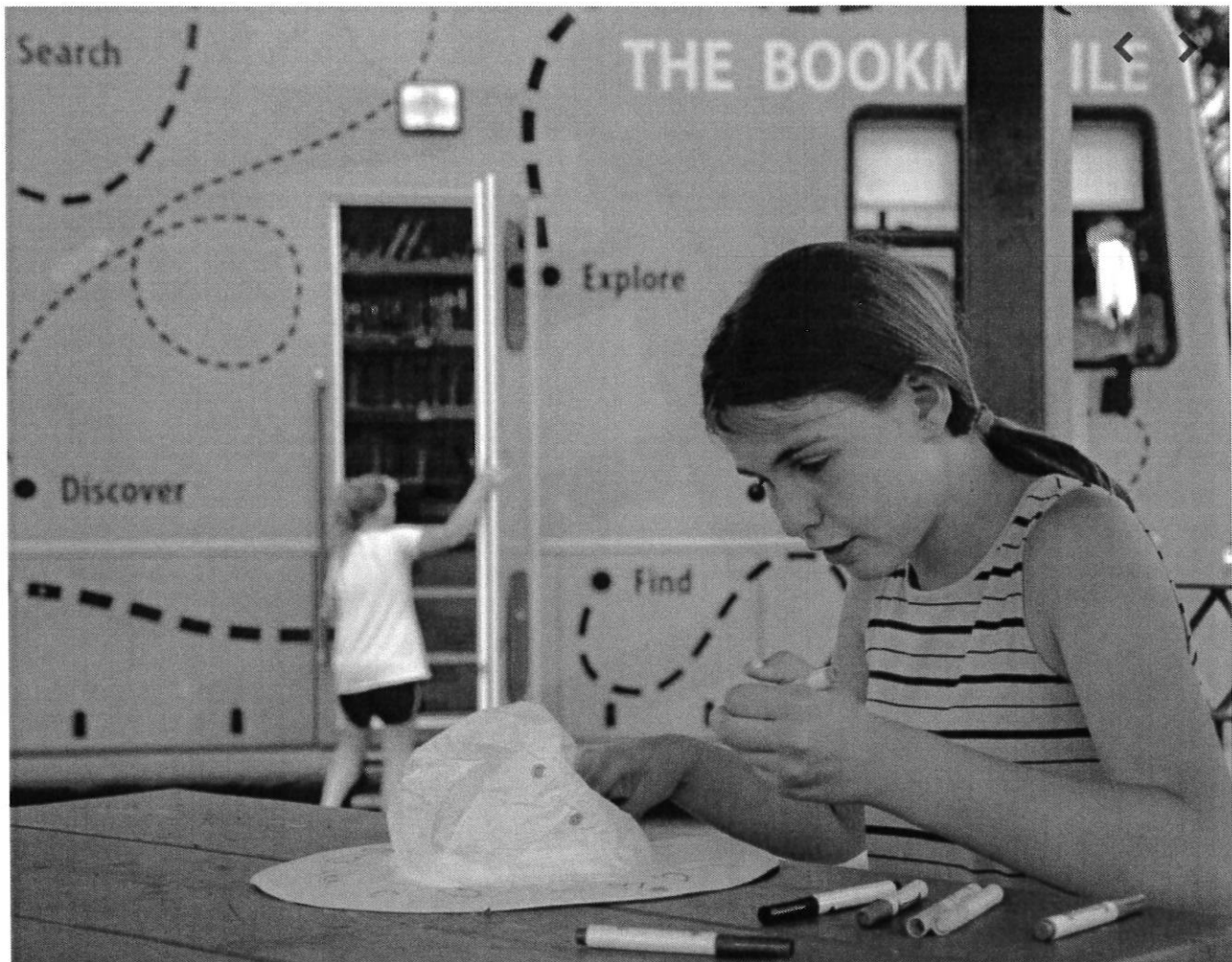

Bookmobile holds summer reading events in Brooklyn

When families from Brooklyn say they're going to the library, they might not mean a building.

Every Thursday evening, about 30 people walk, bike or drive to the gazebo near Commercial and Hotel streets to visit The Bookmobile. The library on wheels travels to communities throughout Dane County so people can check out books, magazines, graphic novels, CDs and DVDs.

Dane County Library Service outreach librarian Mary Driscoll said it's more than just a place to get books.

"It's a wonderful community thing," she said. "It's a nice way to come together and meet neighbors."

It's hard to miss the big green bus, especially when it's surrounded by bubbles.

When the bubble machine is on, kids know there's a craft going on that day.

"It's like the Bat-Signal," Driscoll joked.

Last Thursday, kids decorated hats under the gazebo and then climbed the steps into the bus and browse the shelves to pick out their next read.

Even though there are thousands of materials in the bus available to be checked out, they only represent about 5 percent of the library's inventory, said librarian John Nondorf. But most of the items are newer, including magazines that can hit the stands immediately unlike at other libraries, said The Bookmobile driver and substitute librarian Peter Cupery.

The Bookmobile comes year-round, but it offers more activities during the summer for its "Build a Better World"-themed youth and adult reading programs that run from the second week of June through the last week in August. Each person can set their own goal and earn prizes, Driscoll said.

Craft activities will be offered June 29, July 6, 13 and 20, and there will be a Zoozort live animal show on July 27. For those who need accommodations to attend the programs, call 266-4419 at least two weeks in advance.
